When Will Ferrell finds out his close friend of 30 years is coming out as a trans woman, the two decide to embark on a crosscountry road trip to process this new stage of their relationship in an intimate portrait of friendship, transition, and America. This touching documentary brings humor and inspiration to conversation rooted in good faith. Rated R for language. 2h.

Ghostlight (2024)

In this exquisite Sundance Film Festival hit, a construction worker unexpectedly ends up in a community theater production of "Romeo & Juliet" alongside his distant teen daughter after a family tragedy. As he comes to notice parallels between the play and his own life, the film becomes a powerful treatise on catharsis through art. Rated R for language. 2h.

His Girl Friday (1940)



The League (2023)

In honor of Black History Month, come learn about the African-American baseball players who began forming their own leagues when the color line barred them from joining major league teams in the late 19th century. A must-watch for any sports fan, this gem of a documentary highlights these leagues' pivotal role in African-American communities, featuring rare footage of unsung baseball heroes alongside insights from the likes of Willie Mays and Hank Aaron. The Dead Don't Hurt (2023)

Viggo Mortensen is the writer, director, and star of this stunningly transportive western set during the Civil War. A carpenter (Mortensen) goes to fight for the Union, leaving his very independent love (Vicky Krieps) to fight her own battles at home against the corrupt mayor of a violent town. When they reunite after the war, the couple must process and make peace with the person each has become. Rated R for violence, some sexuality, and language. English, French, and Spanish. 2h10m.

Waitress: The Musical (2023)



Being Mary Tyler Moore (2023)

Shown in recognition of Women's History Month, this loving documentary was made with unprecedented access to the archives of legendary actress Mary Tyler Moore, allowing for an intimate mosaic of her decades-long career. Much of Moore's story is told in her own words, with additional insights from those she worked with and inspired, crafting a fascinating history of women's roles on and off the screen in 20th century America. Rated PG. 2h.

The Persian Version (2023)

This semi-autobiographical film from Maryam Keshavarz was a Sundance hit, jumping between 1960s Iran and current day Brooklyn. Humor, heartache, and healing are woven together as a young Persian-American woman and her estranged mother begin to find common ground through an exploration of their family's past. Rated R for language and some sexual references. 1h45m.

The Wild Robot (2024)

Kick off the Greenwich Library's Innovation Experience weekend with this heartwarming animated film! When an intelligent robot created for human assistance is stranded on an unpopulated island, wild animals help it not only to adapt but to develop relationships and find a higher purpose in existence. This inspiring story of hope and community is perfect for all ages. Rated PG. 1h40m.
